I mean, how are you supposed to answer that, or Hi, all these things that women themselves say they can't stand and won't even tolerate? When men do it. They're thinking, Hey, you know what these guys have to impress me, they have to entertain me, they have to bring something because I have too many options. And I'm too beautiful. I'm too wonderful. I'm too good for all these guys. So they're just going to come from somewhere.

And I didn't have to put anything out there. But because I was a little bit nervous or unsure or, or not so confident in that space. So it's interesting that you would think it was a it was from a place of I'm sitting on this pedestal looking down it on you instead of just potentially acknowledging for what it is. And it is my be a little bit of fear from women.

Well, it could be either work and it totally could for sure. It depends on how long the woman's been online. Certainly if she's new, she's not going to know the ropes. And I certainly counsel guys to figure out if a woman is new online to go out of his way to help her feel more comfortable, like, hey, this will be okay, we do this all the time we get together we meet. But there's a change, there's been a sea change morning in the past six

months, or a year or two where guys are complaining more and more. And this is a real deal. It's a thing, where women, even women who historically may not have gotten as much attention online in the past, as they are now are feeling like they can be on a pedestal. They've got so much attention from so many guys. And they're spoiled for choice to the point where they're just saying, Hey, you know what, I'm not gonna offer anything. You tell me what you've got, I don't have time for you. I don't have time for you. I don't have time for any of you. You tell me what you got you tell what's going on. And guys are very, very frustrated by this. And it's something that's happened lately. Because Hey, you know what, Listen, I've been doing the online dating thing, either personally, or through training other guys how to succeed at it. Since 2002. This is something that has happened since the whole app phenomenon came about. And I think it is heightened relatively recently, within the past year or so, to the point where not only people don't know how to be social with each other, which I acknowledge. You're saying, Hey, you know what women just don't know what they're doing. They're clueless? Well, that's what social media has done to us all. But it seems like there's a bit of an entitlement mentality whereby women are like, you know, you're going to have to do the heavy lifting to make sure we get along here. Yeah, I

Now see, that way, I can figure out something to write you about, I can figure a way to continue the conversation. And indeed, I'm going to also acknowledge what you said earlier that women being clueless, may not realize men are struggling with finding something to say when there's nothing to go on. Yeah, but they indeed are because we're all only human. Here's something that might surprise you, a lot of guys have trouble figuring out what to write women online, even when she spews forth a whole lot of information. Right, they still got nothing, because they don't have the wherewithal to form the words to write a message to know what the appropriate message is going to be, etc. Now that in and of itself is a problem. And what I tell guys in that case, is pretend she's actually started the conversation already. And you're merely continually know the words, you're not starting something. You're reading what she says and saying yourself, okay, if she were here having that actual conversation with me, what would I say to her? That's one of the ways I counsel guys about how to do their online communications with women as it were. Yeah, what I see happening now is because of the vagueness of the app world, in particular, that's bleeding over to the online dating sites also. And what women may not be realizing and you can give your input on this I'd love to hear it is that they're, in turn, driving this condition where men are only going to judge those women by their looks. I found the right thing to say to her what I tell guys to do now, Emily is dyslexic, so she's never been one to enjoy writing. So she had all these pictures of her. And she basically had a very minimalist profile. She didn't want to write much. And I wrote to her I said, Listen, for someone who seems like she'd be a lot of fun to hang out with from your pictures. You sure don't say much. You know, I love that I put my name. I love that. That's what I wrote my wife and man did she write me six paragraphs of the cutest dyslexic lingo you've ever seen in your entire life. And I mean, I'm trained in this stuff, because I used to work with kids. And so I knew immediately she was dyslexic from how she was writing. And I mean, explains everything. That's why she doesn't want to write a whole lot. But I think there's a difference now. And what women don't realize is they're not only being lazy, or being clueless, as you said, so bluntly, and, but they're driving attention from potentially wrong, man. And they're putting themselves in the position of wasting a whole lot of time later, oh, I not spending any time now. And further, you know, we've talked about this on the show. women talk to the men they don't want if they do write something, you know, if you voted for Donald Trump, and you don't make over \$150,000 a year, and you still talk to your

I was very pleasant. My husband was here, we were very nice dates, they spent over an hour with us, they drove at least 45 minutes to our house, I'm



saying they put a commitment in to coming and looking at our home. And then four of them disappeared, three of them took at least a month to give a bit and I had to constantly follow up with them, saying, Are you giving a bit Are you giving a bit and there's a yes, of course, blah, blah, and I'm being super kind and sweet and nice. And then we ended up with this one guy who's been doing our landscaping now for I think, a month and a half. And I have to contact him so much. My point is, is that I'm I'm talking to him. So broadly now over text where I wrote him today saying like, do you even want this job? Like what what is the deal? Are you a billionaire like I like where I was just so frustrated. And that is just from me having to deal with landscapers who flake who seem interested, who give you attention in the beginning and then pull the attention away. So the I'm just trying to draw a parallel to the dating world that that happens consistently for women. And for men, where you're sold by something people want to date you, they don't want to date you they disappear, they have to track them down. You don't know if they like you, it's just all this back and forth, that becomes mentally exhausting, and emotionally exhausting. And so that's why a lot of people are putting up these walls and barriers and they're not realizing for women especially that that is deterring so many wonderful men from coming your way.
