Most of the time when the weather isn't horrible, like during the winter, then I escaped it to loom or somewhere else nice. But when I first moved to Kiev, I got horrible advice from a friend of mine who lived there who was of Ukrainian descent, who basically grew up there. But he went to, he split his time between the US and Ukraine. But he moved there after he finished the army. And the US Army moved to Ukraine. And obviously, he speaks perfectly fluent, Ukrainian and Russian. He's like, yeah, don't bother learning Russian listen to take you forever. You're not going to

need it. Everyone speaks English. And that was just horrible advice, because I just looked like another idiot sex tourist. And there's so many sex tourists in Kiev, that the women kind of use whether or not you can speak a little bit of Russian or Ukrainian as a litmus test. So once I started learning it, I no longer had that stereotype or red flag on my shirt. And it made a huge difference. It's just a sign of respect. And you learn so much more about the culture, being able to speak the damn language, of course.

Yes, 100% agreed. And you know, as you're talking, it brings to mind all those extremely cringe worthy moments, where my wife and I have been traveling overseas. And we've observed at perhaps close range, American sex tourists working there gig. Oh, my God. worthy. There's these old creepy guys who aren't getting any success with women in their native country. And they have hired someone to be an escort. We saw this in Hong Kong, and we've seen it in the Philippines. We've seen it in Thailand, where this girl just doesn't want to be there. She can't get out of there fast enough. We've seen the escort owning the man in public and him just being Mr. Nice Guy and being desperate. And it is it's completely cringe worthy. It's cringe worthy. It's one of the most cringe worthy things you see when traveling. And you know, I mentioned earlier briefly, we kind of just sort of touched upon this issue, but I think it's something that if we don't cover guys are going to wonder why we didn't there's this whole mail order bride thing. I need to go to Ukraine. I mean, Ukraine is a hotspot for this. The women are very flirty, and they're very beautiful. It's a fact it's not myth. That's not right. Colombia, Philippines, Russian brides and guys think, Well, you know what, I'm gonna go find myself a wife over there. And what ends up happening is these are guys who are scapegoating their own culture, in favor of going somewhere else and trying to find a woman, for example, a guy here in the United States may think, Oh, well, they're all just raging feminists who hate men here and they're too independent and finding an American woman. And it would be a good wife is impossible nowadays, which of course, it is not impossible, or it's not. And they have no social skill and they're turning women off. And then what happens is they go to Russia. And as you correctly mentioned, there's a language barrier. And they find themselves better at attracting women when those women don't know what the hell they're talking about, because they can't embarrass themselves or say something stupid. So now without language, there's no language barrier. Without any language barrier, I don't look as socially inept. There was, again, let's use the word cringe worthy. There was a very cringe worthy documentary several years ago that followed the journeys of four or five guys as they went after a mail order bride. And these guys were just, let's just say they all needed a whole lot of self work. But yeah, they were gonna do what I refer to as deserving what they want. That's not why you want to go to another country meet the women learn more about their way of doing things make new friends. discover a new culture. Yeah, being a sex tourist is creepy. And the only thing creepier is feeling like you've got to go to another country and take advantage of some woman because you can't do well with women here. It's like I've told guys, yeah, and women in New York or Los Angeles, hey, look, you know what, if you feel like you've got to go outside your metro area to find someone to fall in love with? Yeah, I mean, the first one is eye contact, I can't emphasize eye contact enough. And that was one of the like the last things that I really even bothered to, for whatever reason, kind of focus on. And I don't know why maybe it was just like we mentioned earlier in the call just all the stuff that I was studying when it came to dating advice, all the stuff out there. But being able to confidently hold a woman's gaze, not just that, but being able to communicate with your eyes, and at least show her that you're comfortable with her that she turns you on. There's so much that can be said with eye contact. But if you're afraid to communicate in that way, or you don't know how to, you're really missing out on everything, because foreign women communicate way more with eye contact. Another thing that just in terms of traveling and and realizing I could do was just the whole idea of living kind of the nomadic lifestyle unplugging from the US learning about different cultures. I wanted to I didn't want to just go on these little like one or two week trips. I wanted to really immerse myself. So after I spent the summer traveling abroad, I went all through Europe in 2012. rented a car with my buddy and Basically does a giant lap of Europe, I was like, I have got to get back here and I want to come back for a longer period of time. So I put my place on Airbnb, and the the money I was able to make from just renting out my place was enough to cover most of my trip, because when you go abroad, things are way cheaper. You know, if you're making us dollars, and you're spending the local currency, you're usually doing very well, especially in a lot of these countries where, you know, they're a little bit less developed like Ukraine, or Colombia, a lot of places down in South America, Eastern Europe. So it's just such a, it's a great opportunity to not just meet women improve your social skills, you can save money in the process, you can use that money to come back and you know, invest in other things. Like basically, when I was living in New York, and I tracked my expenses, I was making around 2013, I think I made 150k. And I spent 150k. And then the next year, when I went over to Eastern Europe, I made the same amount, but I spent 50k. So that extra 100k, in my pocket was a big boost. And not just my competence, but my lifestyle,


