But I think a lot of times the term Mr. Right is really reserved for women's dating advice, because it just kind of doesn't resonate with men. Although I actually looked at David de Angelo's catalogue of dating advice, which have been off the market since earlier this year. But you know, at one time, he was basically the 900 pound gorilla in the men's dating advice space. And he had a program called How to be Mr. Right? So how dare me not have a podcast on the subject or trying to avoid this phraseology whatsoever? Because I think a lot of guys know what it means to be Mr. Right, even if it's kind of a feminine term. And however we phrase it, we certainly want to be that guy for the right woman. That's what I call deserving what you want. So why don't you tell us a little bit Polina about what your rendition of Mr. Right is, and why that's such a, I guess, a beloved phrase to women, it kind of just conjures up a lot in a woman's imagination, doesn't it?

Correct. This is exactly the biggest myth that there is this one unique, special person out there and you just have to find them. For that person's perfect array, though. They're perfect. And you can spend a lot of time searching doing a lot of eating activities and staying busy dating and remain single because of it. There isn't just one person. I use a system of personnel I think called a new style, which is psychology back that based on Carl Jung's Psychological Types. So it's completely legitimate, it's the most effective way to understand the differences between people that are inherent strengths and inherent attractive qualities that we have. That also, the other side of that is certain weaknesses, when you know, and chances are everyone already knows that certain people are very logical, and they are less emotional and vice versa. Some people are very creative, some people are very driven and very powerful and forceful. And when you understand that, there are always different personality types, no one is all in one,

there is this person just does not exist. So if you're looking for somebody who is as Mr. Perfect, chances are, it's going to take you a very long time to find him because he doesn't exist, or she doesn't exist.

Many, many people, many outlets of dating advice, many, even in the psychotherapy field would say that, Oh, women are emotional, and men are logical. What do you have to say about that?

When it comes to energies, versus feminine and masculine energies, we are forming personality types and a new style, it's easy to remember them, because they are labeled as four cardinal points, north, east, south and west, and even their qualities and strengths. If you think about geography, make sense North is going to be very rational, structural, logical, non emotional, is think about Eastern the world. Its intuitive wisdom, creativity, ideas. South is all about fun, comfort, food, pleasure, relationships, saving time. And where's this power, ambition drive next level impact, the number one in the best, and western north are masculine energies, east and south are feminine. We are men and women of his different personality types. Each of us has all of us four energies, but in very different proportions. And each of us is going to have a main two that are going to be the strongest. So if it's a man who is Northwest, he's going to be very, very masculine. Or it could be a woman born in that personality type very, very strong woman,

You know, it's interesting that you had mentioned that this was familiar to the Russian speaking world, but you're the first one ever to introduce it to the English speaking world. Because I think people who are English speakers see Russians as having a very unique view on the world. A lot of times, at least the stereotype is that Russians are a little more blunt, perhaps a little more dark, a little more straightforward, less emotional, when they talk to you. Like, for example, someone who has emigrated from Russia to the United States may see someone in the United States doing something that's perhaps foolish, and they may go, why are you being so stupid, that's never going to end? Well, you should do something completely different. And that's really seen as really rude by Americans, but people in Russia like that with each other all the time and grateful to each other for it. You know, so does that have something to do with it? Or is it simply because the language is so different? And even the written language is so different? Why do you think it took so long to migrate over here because it makes perfect sense,

I think with differences come from the culture and specifically the former Soviet Union. The understanding that collective dominated over all took precedence over individual. What's interesting about in your style, the system that I use is that, ironically, it was developed in the country that did not recognize psychology. And it wasn't even a thing. Because everyone was working towards this one clear goal, which was building communism. and the Soviet Union, the communist government, or Jim paid. This couple who created the system, and funded their research, they had a laboratory of over 150 scientists, and they had access to everything from Eric Bern transactional analysis to classical psychology, Carl Jung's, to Nero linguistic programming, all of their American research, all of a work that was done by American psychologist, they connected the dots, they had to put it together in order to determine exactly specific personality type that could deliver nuclear weapons to this territory in Baikonur, and the government wanted to know exactly what personality type what kind of people can be trusted to do this work that potentially could just blow up the whole the whole place. And that is how this system was created. It was for political reasons, it was for security, national security reasons. And they came up with a very simple, very clear system, where specific types that is a North type, very logical, very consistent over follow all the rules, who will do everything by the book, there is a certain body type, there is a certain way how that person thinks so and for every personality type, they determined exactly a very certain traits, how this person will dress, how we communicate, for each type, how are they going to behave in stressful situations? How are they going to make decisions, and it's extremely objective, simple and accurate. So when it comes to dating, the benefit of learning the system and using it yourself, which anyone can learn in just a few hours, is to be able to look at the person who's sitting right in front of you, on your first date, ask him just a few targeted questions. Use the criteria that I mentioned, like your body type, like their communication, style, and so on, very personal style, what we do for leading all of that is driven by our strengths. When we naturally aligned with our type, when we
