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

Yes, it's a pleasure to have you on. You know, I was telling you before we hit record on this particular program, and these guys all know this, that I have a pair of body language experts on my team, but they tend to do something that's kind of their own thing. They're specialists, if you will, in kinesiology and human movement and how to be attractive with that. You're more of a holistic practitioner when it comes to these matters of body language and how to read someone's signals having been a spy, aren't you?

Yeah, yeah, that's more me. So kind of well rounded.

Well, tell us a little bit about your history. I mean, you're coming from the world of military intelligence. And obviously, the more information you can gather, even about the people in a particular target area or hotspot, as well as the people who your adversaries, you know, the more you know, the better suited you are to go to war with them right or to make. Yeah, tell us a little bit about that. Sure.

So, I mean, the first and most important thing to know that, I've been asked to describe what it means to be a spy. And the best description I ever heard was actually from a friend of mine, he said, it's to make friends. And that's what we do, we go out into the world into foreign countries, and we make friends and give opportunities to people who are working in positions where they have access to secrets. And when we are friends with that person, if we've done our job properly, we can then get them to kind of obtain those secrets for us. So that's a very short summarized version of what we do. And with that in mind, that means you have to go out, you have to build rapport fast, you have to know and be able to gauge somebody fast, whether they're interested or not, whether they are an open and trustworthy person to a degree and whether you can win them over and get them onside. And you have to do that pretty damn quick.

What are the first things you would tell any man listening about how to get better with women by learning how to read their signals, and maybe gauge their interest in you upfront? Because I know Gavin, that's probably in the top five questions I'm ever asked. So these guys are waiting with bated breath for your answer on this one. So go ahead. Sure.

So, so what I'll do, I'll start with the output of what a person does and how they act. And then we'll go into the signals of kind of the signals you're spotting, because with women, they are very, very subtle. And, and I will also address something which I mentioned to you earlier called the alpha male fallacy. And if you go into a lot of the kind of, you know, YouTube says, and gurus and that kind of thing, they'll say, Oh, you'll be more alpha be more masculine. And if you just take that into mind, and you're gonna walk into every room like a gorilla I start growling at people the way that these people give advice, you're not really gonna get anywhere, you actually need to be much more approachable. And being this alpha male, if you want to call it that is it's it's not so much about the physical dominance you have in a room in your stance and how your your body language is perceived, but more about how you are mentally your mental strength that you projected around the room towards people. Does that make sense so far?

Well, yeah, I mean, first thing that comes to mind is almost every time I hear someone in the dating advice world or the masculinity community, if you want to call it that, talk about being alpha or beta. They're usually not. It's usually a yes show. Right? So when you're talking about something called the Alpha fallacy, that's the first thing I thought of. You also mentioned the concept of women, you know, kind of giving subtle signals. And I know that tends to be our general understanding of how women operate. And indeed, they'd love when men lead right and they also love not to throw themselves that men because they know that it's generally not going to work well for them. And of course, they don't want to look like Blyton sluts tip. Nowadays, you know, we're headed into the year 2024. Here, women are a lot bolder women will make that first move sometimes if they feel they need to, but they would still rather not. So I think these guys are very, very eager to hear some examples of the subtle signals that women might give. Sure, they're attracted, you know?

Yeah. And, and because they also subtle, you know, you need you need to be on board with a lot of them. And I mean, one of the, one of the ones that I remember telling somebody about a few years ago was the change in pitch in voice when they're talking to you. And there was one particular female, I'm not gonna say her name, but she used to do live streams. And she kind of as more and more people would join, she'd call their name. And I always was amused every time she called my name because she got Oh, Hi, John. Hi, Darren. Hi, Dave. Oh, hi, Gavin. As you can hear the increase, and he kind of gave it away immediately. So that, and obviously I did over exaggerate a little bit there. But that very subtle kind of increasing pitch in voice tone. When a woman is talking, believe it or not, is a very, very big sign that she's attracted to you. Well,

So it's something that you have to be very conscientious of when you're talking to somebody, you know, when you're talking to a female, bear in mind that they're not going to always be as bold as Hey, hey, I'm a Joe Biden fan, or I hate Donald Trump or I'm or the other way around, or whichever way it is. They may wait for you to turn around first and say, Oh, I'm gonna Trumpster throw and throw. And then they'll go, oh, yeah, me too. I like him. You know, something,

you know, a couple things just jump right out at me there. First of all, talking about how your pitch goes up, and you're more excited. And he may even be also nervous with that. Notice how I suddenly lowered my pitch right in the middle of a sentence there. Doesn't mean I'm any less excited about this topic, Gavin. I'm actually thrilled about this topic. I'm already all in. I'm deeply fascinated. Anyway, it seems to me that you're dead on accurate as I'm sure you are, because you're an expert in these matters. But I've observed also how when women stumble over their words a little or not necessarily have the right thing to say to you. That isn't a sign, they're disinterested, it's a sign they're trying not to mess up. Yeah. And that's not gender specific. I mean, if we turn the mirror back in our own direction as men, right, that's how we are. We're kind of try not to mess up and we're looking for the right words. And even as grown as adults, even women can be like that. So they're little in all of you or they're initially attracted to you. They may not be as fluid in their conversation as they are even with your friends standing next to you. So I thought that was really, really a good bit of advice for these guys to look for that. I think a much more subtle version of that indicates discord or someone being uncomfortable with you like when they greet you. They might go. Hello, Gavin.

Yeah, listen for that outward breath. Yeah, right. Yeah, yeah. You did it yourself. Then just when you were demonstrating you got the hell out Gavin. You know, if you're listening for that, it's almost like a kind of the pain themselves to say the words

hello, Gavin. It could also be like, hello, Gavin. Like, they're just acknowledging you're there. But they want out because they don't want to have this conversation. If they find you tedious, or boring, they may have that up tick in their pitch when they're done. Like, hello, Gavin.

And with that in mind, I mean, nine times out of 10 that if a female does have an interest in you, they will see you coming. And as you come in, they'll give this very kind of cool Hello. Like, like they didn't notice you. And it's really, really interesting. It's great, because I've seen it so many times. They're not, they're not just going to say, Oh, you're brilliant, you're amazing, you know, or you're really, if they operate different to men so that they'll they'll say something along the lines of, you know, I feel safe when you're around or something along those lines, and they're complimenting your masculinity, morsels and compliment, you're looking good like a man, a man will tend to go, Oh, you've got beautiful eyes on this should never use that. I'll give them something better later. But they'll tend to compliment on physical features, whereas women will compliment more on personality time.

How about that you've ever listened to my show before? You probably don't even know me from Adam. And you're talking just like, you're a member of our team around here. Guys, you guys listen to us, because he knows what he's talking about. These aren't ideas that we invent. These are observations from the real world. Yes, indeed, women will give you compliments about how they feel based on the masculinity you're projecting. So absolutely, yes, they'll say things like, Oh, I feel so safe when you're around. Or I love how you got everything under

No, yeah. And you know what I'll tell guys how to affect these responses and women you're talking about, and they'll come back and they'll still be looking for pickup lines. Like I told a story specifically about not too long ago, about how I use the power of observation, to build a conversation with a woman naturally. And sure enough, I got an email from a guy who took one of the specific things out of that observational conversation and said, I've been going around using your opener where you say this, it's just falling flat, and it's not working? Am I saying it wrong? Do you say it more? Quietly? Do you say it with more energy, and I had to explain to him I go, I've never taught going around and using that as a canned line to meet window just was simply something I observed in the moment. You know, there's a proverbial forest to be seen here for the trees. Yeah.

Yeah. You've just taken me back to when I used to teach this stuff, and have so many people, you know, the students would be coming up to me, what's the line? What's the line? What do I

say? And I ve thed to say to them, Look, it's not about what you say, it's nothing to do with what you say, it's the delivery. And that doesn't just mean the confidence behind the words, it means you have a whole as an entire package, you know, and I used to watch these guys, and I used to do a test. So we'd go we'd go, we'd all arranged to meet at a bar, where I know there'd be a lot of nightlife on one by one, I would send them to ask a girl for a date or for a phone number, or whatever the case may be. And I would watch them from the minute they picked themselves up. And sometimes it take them a while, and several drinks before they finally built up the courage to go for it. And when they watched them kind of build up the courage stand up and say, right, I'm going for it. And the first few paces were big and long and strong and masculine. So you're all in the mall. And he got he'll turn around, say, right, I want you to go into the jewelry store, I want you to talk up to the you walk up to the blonde lady behind the counter. And I want you to tell them that you have a small and I don't know what your rules are here with whether you beat things out or whether you but you know, a small manhood or that you suffer with premature problems.

But then after 11 years is to lunchtime, you have to stay around and get a reaction or a reply. And then after lunchtime, I want you to then try and continue from that awkward conversation. I want you to rescue it. Nine times out of 10 by three o'clock. You were seeing guys who were falling apart only a few

minutes before walking up to beautiful women, or going hey, you know what, my balls hang really low. But I just wondered if I can have your phone number. I know that was a stupid way to start a conversation but I really don't care. I've never seen one bigger anywhere, but I don't want to talk out of turn. It goes literally for half a mile. And if you don't think that's a lot, go put five tenths of a mile on your car in a straight line, and then just consider how far you've really gone. Okay, yeah. Anytime a major league baseball player hits a homerun, that's a 10th of a mile, it would be one of the longest homeruns in Major League history. So this is 10 times as long as that. Does you have a unique name, what music is playing, and I start talking with, you know, warm, positive energy that will make a woman feel safe about anything, but why she's there. And then the next thing you know, she's actually enjoying herself. And then from there, the conversation flows a lot more easily. And what typically happens when the guys start trying this is they realize that women aren't so scary after all, men, and they actually like to have fun. And I'm also a sneaky bastard Gavin. I'm a sneaky bastard. We start by talking to women who aren't really all that beautiful. Now, you gotta be careful about talking to women who are really, really ugly, because they have no practice. And they really don't know why any guy is talking to them. Because they don't get any attention from a guy. Yeah. But if you start talking to women who most men would kind of slot in the quote unquote, average department, right? They're not afraid of those women, because they really don't have a sexual agenda with those women. And they find, hey, you know what these women are, are not so bad to talk to they're, they're not going to reject me rudely. Actually, in 15 years of doing infield work, and I've never seen a quote unquote, rude rejection. I've never seen one. We never give women reason to do that. It's not if I can feel guys will say to me, you know, now I understand why you've never had a rude rejection. We haven't given them anything to reject rudely. I go, Yeah, they'd have to be some kind of maniac to you know, some kind of psycho, responsive negatively to someone who's presenting something so positive. And then, like I said, I'm a sneaky bastard. You know, a couple hours later, it's kind of like the proverbial boiling of the frog, right? If we started talking to these gorgeous, beautiful, attractive women, you know, straight away, these guys would

jump out of the hot pot, you know, ouch. I don't want to do that. But yeah, kind of boil that proverbial frog over time. And after they see the consistency of these conversations with women, suddenly, sneaky bastards such that I am, I've started talking to more and more beautiful women. And we're suddenly talking to women who are absolutely desirable. And guess what? The conversation isn't much different. Yeah. And one of the things you hit the nail on the head, in my estimation, and of course you did because you're an expert, right? Is how women start acknowledging masculinity in men as a sign of attraction. Because that masculine feminine dance is what attraction is all about. masculinity and femininity around here are defined as the polarizing effect of masculinity and femininity, right? It's the language of sexual attraction. So if we start with like, understanding a little bit more about, like what are called the multi alpha, there are these areas where you can be an alpha male in business, for example, but still fall apart around women, you can be an alpha male, yeah, you can be an alpha male at sports. And this is where so many people go wrong. And I've seen this time and time again, I'm going to buy a Porsche because I want to look more masculine and successful. I want to go to the gym and build muscles. And I have seen like you said, you some of the most chiseled chin, good looking guys with six pack abs and everything, and they've gone out and they don't understand why they're getting rejected, or why they, you know, the women that they're talking to very, very quickly go off the boil. Women are amazing at subconsciously testing you to see if you're alpha and and the way to kind of be aware of this is listen to the questions they're asking. But the whole kind of leading concept, stop turning around and saying things like, Would you like to go for ice cream? Would you like to go for pizza? We what you do is you grab your jacket, you put it on? You go I'm going for pizza? Do you want to come? Well,

you're gonna be crappy in bed. Yeah, exactly. Yeah, and probably won't be able to dance and probably won't be able to cook. But the end of the day is if they're talking about sex, they are they are telling you, I'm talking about it, because I'm thinking about it. And I'm talking about it with you, because I'm thinking about it with you. So they're gauging what your response would be. And the best advice here for anybody is, if it were a woman turns around and says, Yeah, I'd love to strip my clothes off and get naked and dance around here. What would you do? You know, your turn around, and you can, you've got two ways you can do this, you can either flirt back and say, Well, I would take all my clothes off as well, but it's so cold, and I'd shrink right down to 15 inches. So there's no way I'm doing that in public. And you know, who kind of see how they respond, or you turn around and say, probably film it and bribe you. And then I could use that as blackmail material to get you to do anything I wanted you to do. And then see whether she is kind of how she reacts to that kind of what would you have me doing? So you know, and this because this whole flirtation is where it's at? That's more fun for them than direct, you know, the innuendos that are much more fun than I want to do X to you.



Well, something you bring up there something we've talked about quite a bit on this show, which is most men see flirting is a binary act. Either I'm avoiding you or I'm showing blatant sexual interest in you. Are you flipping a light switch? Yeah. Whereas almost all women inherently understand, at least more naturally. So than men do that flirting is like a dial you turn up. Yeah, so perfectly happily, married adults can acknowledge each other's masculinity and femininity during a conversation and stay pretty innocent about it. And then when that starts turning up sexually, a little bit over time, then you can start reading each other's sexual interest. And if you're available, and you're getting along, then it gets really horny. Then the next thing you know, you do strip naked and tear each other up in bed. Exactly. Women see that more as a process. Yeah. Yeah.

It's very rare. You can kind of walk straight up to a woman and say, Hey, you want to jump into the bed with me? You know, and they're gonna they're not gonna turn around and go look at your goal. Yeah, yes, please. You know, unless Channing Tatum or something.

You know, one particular thing you just said is worth underscoring. I think it's extremely important. This idea of a binary flirting situation where you go from ignoring her to expressing blatant sexual interest that most guys define flirting as, it's actually an extraordinarily rare happenstance. And most guys daring never to flirt because we know that yet where you have it the wherewithal to realize hey, you know what, maybe we can be a little bit more subtle upfront, like women respond so powerfully to this is a huge breakthrough for a lot of guys. Do you think only men who are almost universally attractive to all women find her attractive? Or do you think these ugly schmoes, who have you know, no chance with any woman are basically in cells or whatever? Do you think they find her attractive also, and the guys will look at me like that's a silly question. Well, okay, now imagine an actress who find unattractive, right? Do only the desirable men find her unattractive? Or do all those insole guys also find her unattractive? And they're like, wait a minute, I think I know where you're going with this. I know exactly. You're either a guy who's masculine, and is putting off that vibe that women like, or you're not. So guys will come up to me Gavin, and they'll go well, I can get all the average women to fall in love with me. But when it comes time to talk to a woman, I'm really attracted to the wheels fall off. Yeah, no, that's because something changes. You. You take that well practiced confidence and demeanor from talking to all those women, and carry it over naturally, in a situation where you're attracted to her. You know, when I say day one, obviously, I mean, within the first few minutes, when you're when you're when you're first starting this, what you want to do is it's got to be subtle to start with, you know, it's got to be Hey, you know what, what you're doing otherwise, I won't be responsible for my actions, or, you know, you keep doing that now, you know, you never know what I'm going to end up doing to you. And I'm waiting to have the gun. What do you mean by that? They've got it. It's got to be something that they've got a question. Is he flirting with me to start with?

And most women do have low self esteem. So on the surface, it may look like it's working a little bit. But when you started assaulting women, and when you start saying you're not interested, this is the opposite of making them feel safe and comfortable and see really it's just a camouflage of your own insecurity. Yes, if you're secure enough to go, hey, you know what, there are a lot of women in this room but I think I'd rather talk to you. You I like you're projecting that confidence and you're choosing her without the need to like knock her off a pedestal. Exactly. The next thing you know simply because you're the guy who isn't fawning all over her and so utterly in all of her, she feels like okay, here's a guy in my league and I could talk to him and there's no mess, no fuss.
