I think I can tie it all together by saying this, when ever someone senses you're on their side, instead of against them, and that you're building an alliance with them, and that you do mean well, and again, you know, I'm sure there are women out there who are the proverbial wolf in sheep's clothing, right. Trying to perpetrate like they're giving good advice, but really, they're just leading people astray. I know, that probably happens in both men's and women's dating advice. But when people can read someone who would be a potential mentor, or a potential source for advice, in general, whatever you want to call them, as someone who's with them instead of against them.
